Electrical Panel Fire Hazard

This article is very important for all residents in the original section of Westover. You need to check your electrical panel, and pronto.

The Zinsco electrical panels installed in Westover homes in the 1970s were recalled due to a potential for serious fire hazards. There have been numerous reported cases in Westover. For example, **Audrey Newell** and her family just moved into Westover and have first hand experience on this subject. Thanks to Audrey for this timely information, as follows:

"We had a Zinsco electrical panel that dated to the construction of our home in 1976. These electrical panels are known to be "serious electrical hazards," with detailed information available on several electrical websites. When we purchased our home in August, we were warned of this during our home inspection. We had the replacement of the electrical panel on our list of things to do, but we hadn't made it the top priority. Over the weekend, we had a small electrical fire when a power outlet sparked. Luckily, nobody was hurt, but the breaker to the sparking circuit didn't trip, and the wires remained hot even after the fire was out. We had to manually throw the breaker and call for an electrician. After this first-hand demonstration of the hazard these electrical panels exhibit, we had our panel replaced in one day at a cost of about \$700. We had three bids ranging from \$700 - \$1,200 for the replacement. We also purchased two new fire extinguishers and did a family fire drill."

According to a home inspector website, home inspectors should notify potential homeowners that a "Zinsco TM or Sylvania TM-Zinsco electrical panel is installed in this building. Serious electrical hazards may be present in the electrical panel which could result in overheating, fire, or inability to turn off the electrical power in the home. A licensed electrician who is familiar with this equipment should be called to inspect the panel for immediate fire and shock hazards,

and regardless of its visually-apparent condition, this equipment should be replaced. Additional information about this hazard is available at an independent building failures research website: www.inspect-ny.com/electric/Zinsco.htm

Westover is Safe

Chief Andreoli of the Hampden Township Police Department met with the Village of Westover Board of Directors recently and provided us with a police report for Hampden Township, as well as for Westover. The chief was happy to report that crime in Westover is minimal and that Westover stacks up near the top for safety.

Chief Andreoli had a knowledge of each of the categories listed below, and pointed out that if someone calls to report a burglary, for example, and the police find a back door open with nothing taken or disturbed, then that incident goes into the books as a burglary. He cautioned that what is behind the numbers is important and not reported here. He was pleased that there were no robberies (seizing property with violence or intimidation) in Westover.

The Chief encourages all residents to report suspicious activity and to let the police do their job. Do not jeopardize your safety at any time....call the police!

Hampden Township Tan Bark or Leaf Compost Available for Delivery to Your Door!

Hampden Township has offered to deliver tan bark and leaf compost from the Yard Waste Composting facility right to your door. The product is free but there is a delivery charge of \$30.00 for 3 cubic yards and \$50.00 for 8 cubic yards.

The tan bark and leaf compost is the same material we use in the community parks within Westover. It is a wonderful way to recycle and reuse those leaves and sticks that the township picks up at your house. It is not treated or dyed, but it is good and viable tan bark. You need to go to the Township Administrative Building on Sporting Hill Road and pay first, then the township crews will deliver the material within three working days. They will deliver it to your driveway and will not place it on the streets. You can call 761-0119 for more information.
