Pedestrian Safety in Westover

The Civic Association continues to receive concerns about close calls between pedestrians and vehicles in the neighborhood. Drivers, pedestrians, and parents all share the responsibility of keeping Westoer a safe place to live and play. Speed limits in Westover are 25 mph or less and stop signs are strategically placed. Please review the following safety tips which were also shared in a community email last summer.

Pedestrians and Runners

Be predictable. Follow the rules of the road and obey signs and signals. * Walk on sidewalks whenever they are available. * Runners should keep to the edge of the street or as close to the shoulder as possible. If there is no sidewalk, walk facing traffic and as far from traffic as possible. * Keep alert at all times; don't be distracted by electronic devices that take your eyes (and ears) off the road. * Cross streets at crosswalks or intersections whenever possible. This is where drivers expect pedestrians. Look for cars in all directions - including those turning left or right. *Be visible at all times. Wear bright clothing during the day, and wear reflective materials or use a flashlight at night. * Watch for cars entering or exiting driveways, or backing up in parking lots. *Avoid alcohol and drugs when walking; they impair your abilities and judgment too.

Drivers

Look out for pedestrians everywhere, at all times. Safety is a shared responsibility. *Slow down and be prepared to stop when turning or otherwise entering a crosswalk. * Yield to pedestrians in crosswalks and stop well back from the crosswalk to give other vehicles an opportunity to see the crossing pedestrians so they can stop too. * Never pass vehicles stopped at a crosswalk. There may be people crossing that you can't see. * Never drive under the influence of alcohol and/or drugs. *Follow slower speed limits in school zones and in neighborhoods where there are children present. * Be extra cautious when backing up - pedestrians can move into your path.



Public Safety Update



This update is brought to you courtesy of Hampden Township Police Department.

Neighbors, continue to be attentive when driving through Westover. As the weather warms up and daylight extends, residents are spending more time outside and kids are riding bikes and chasing balls more often.

It is tax time and we will be seeing an increase in scam calls claiming to be from the IRS. The IRS will not contact you in this manner. Residents can contact police or the IRS if they want to be sure.

As a reminder, there is a medication disposal box conveniently located at the Hampden Township Police Department. Township residents can dispose of out-of-date and unused prescriptions and over-the-counter medicines in a special container, called "Med Return," that has been installed in the lobby of the Township Police Station at 230 S. Sporting Hill Road. Users are asked to either remove all prescription medication labels or place all the pills in a plastic ziploc bag. Guidelines for lobby hours and disposal <u>can be found here on the Police Department website</u>.

The Hampden Township Police Department, in partnership with the Cumberland County Drug and Alcohol Commission will be sponsoring a Naloxone training event conducted by the Rase Project of Carlisle. This event will be held on April 15th, 2019 at 6:00 pm at the Hampden Township Fire Station, 1200 Good Hope Road. Participants will receive a brief overview of the science behind addiction and recovery, learn about Naloxone, and learn how to properly administer it. At the end of the event, participants will receive a training certificate and free Naloxone. Pre-registration is required! To register, email kristinv@raseproject.org or call 717-249-6499. Hampden Township Police Department will no longer be offering fingerprinting services. The existence of private companies offering fingerprinting, coupled with security concerns in providing the service, lead to this decision. In order to be fair to private vendors of this service, we will not be recommending specific locations or vendors for fingerprinting. This decision does not impact the processing of defendants in criminal proceedings.
