




The RTP

Neighbors, continue to be attentive when driving through Westover. As the weather warms up and daylight extends, residents are spending more time outside and kids are riding bikes and chasing balls more often. Also as weather gets warmer we usually see an increase in vehicle break ins. Vast majority of the time the vehicles were left unlocked.

It is tax time and we will be seeing an increase in scam calls claiming to be from the IRS. The IRS will not contact you in this manner. Residents can contact police or the IRS if they want to be sure.

On the inquiry about the DUI stops on Skyport Road (evident on the police blotter), these are nothing unusual. We have not had any upticks in violations but it never hurts to remind people to be aware. Skyport is a road people may use to avoid the Carlisle Pike.
